



NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES AND MEMBERS



POSTED PURSUANT TO A SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT APPROVED BY A REGIONAL DIRECTOR OF THE NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD AN AGENCY OF THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT

FEDERAL LAW GIVES YOU THE RIGHT TO:

- Form, join, or assist a union;
- Choose a representative to bargain with your employer on your behalf;
- Act together with other employees for your benefit and protection;
- Choose not to engage in any of these protected activities.

WE WILL NOT depart from our established hiring hall rules by failing or refusing to refer you to work for arbitrary or discriminatory reasons or in bad faith.

WE WILL NOT remove you from our hiring hall because you filed charges with the National Labor Relations Board, or for any other unlawful reason.

WE WILL NOT in any like or related manner restrain or coerce you in the exercise of your above rights guaranteed under Section 7 of the National Labor Relations Act.

WE WILL make MARY HALL whole for the loss of earnings and other benefits she suffered as a result of our refusal to refer her to work on October 26, 2019, October 27, 2019, November 10, 2019, November 17, 2019, November 23, 2019, and January 18, 2020.

WE WILL make referrals from our hiring hall in accordance with our established hiring hall rules, and based on objective criteria.
